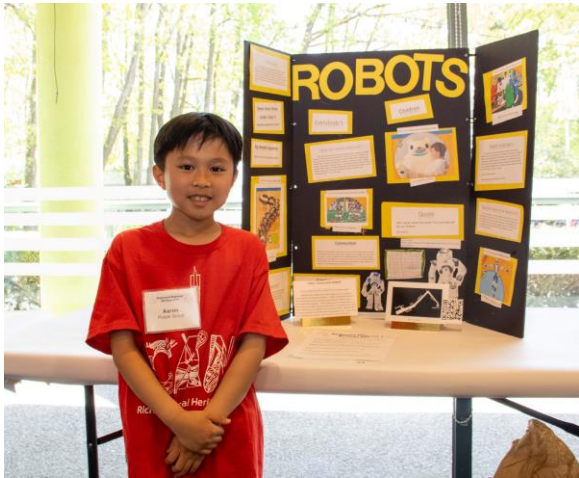


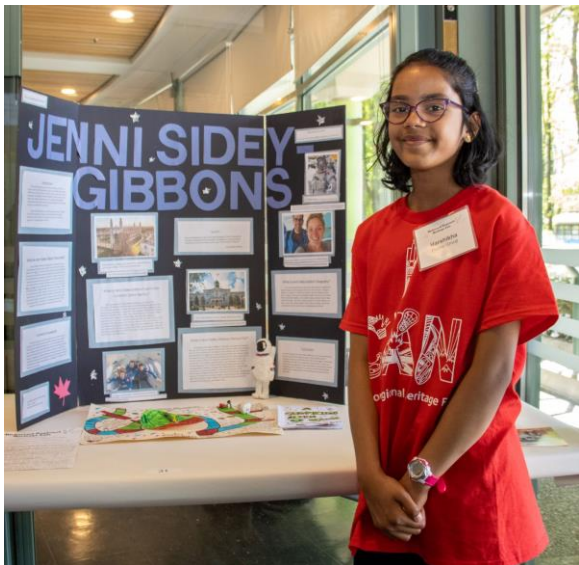
Heritage Fair 2023 Award Recipients

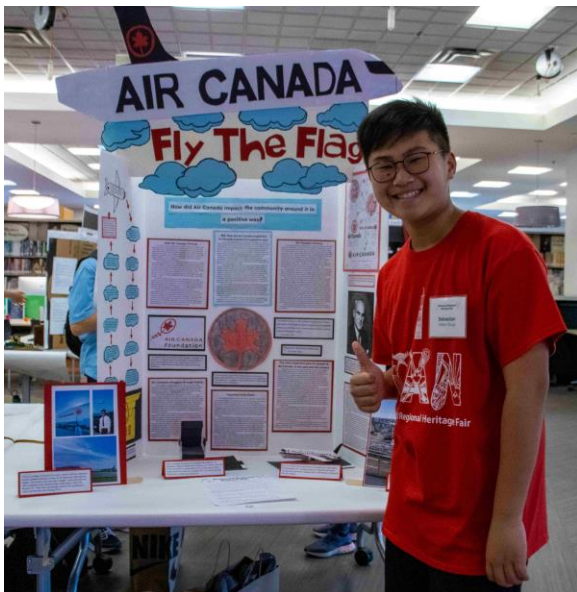

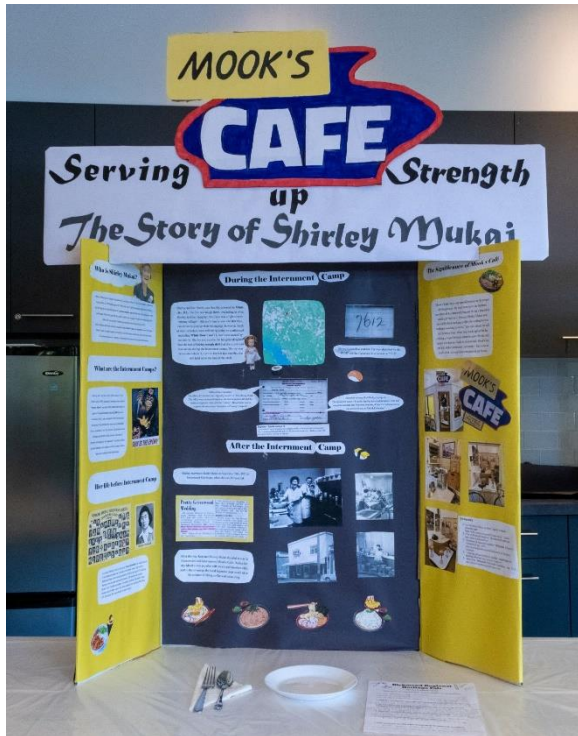


3. BC Heritage Fairs Stellar Achievement Award

4. Heritage BC Award

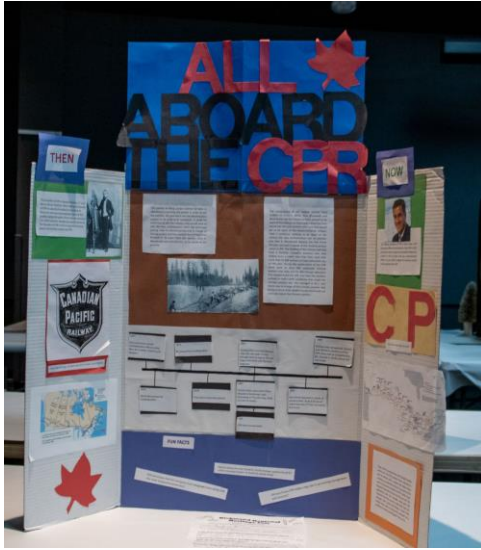

A project that has as its theme a person, place or event of national historic importance as commemorated by the Historic Sites and Monuments Board.

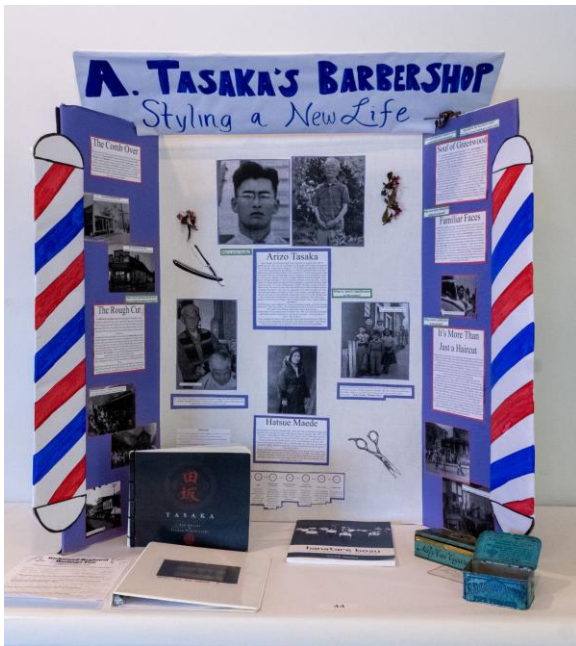

6. Canadian Museum of History Award of Excellence

From the Canadian Museum of History and the Canadian War Museum: Awarded to a student whose project demonstrates excellence in understanding and explaining how an event, experience, person, or object has helped shape Canada's history and identity, and how Canada fits into world history and culture.

A project that demonstrates excellence in use of historic and/or blended photographs in the project presentation.

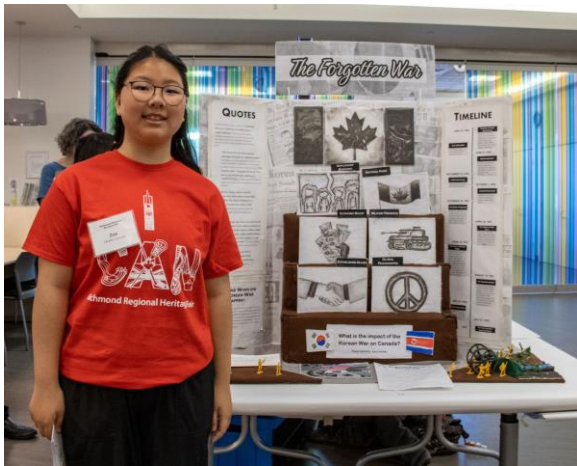

8. Simon Fraser University Department of History Community Heritage Award

Awarded for the best project that explores an aspect of a community's unique history or heritage. Special consideration given for projects that consider and explore the history, contribution, impact, and importance of a region's Indigenous inhabitants and/or minority communities.

9. BC Retired Teachers Association Award

A project that reflects excellence in a seldom researched area of knowledge, and/or a project which has mentoring between students and seniors as a significant component

10. Historic Places Award

A project on a historic place in BC which highlights an aspect of history or heritage related to buildings or the built environment. Students must demonstrate enthusiasm for the history and culture of British Columbia's architecture and historic places, reflecting the values these places hold for the community and/or for the student.

11. Chinese Canadian Historical Society of BC History Award

Award presented to a student who demonstrates exceptional passion for history in their project and presentation.

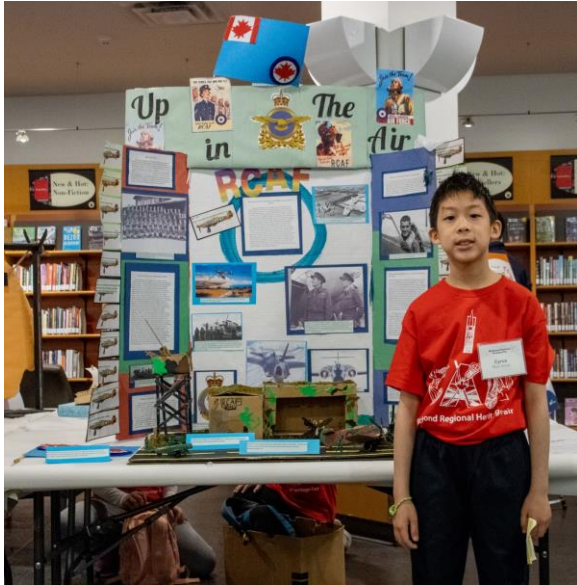

An outstanding project on a Canadian institution.

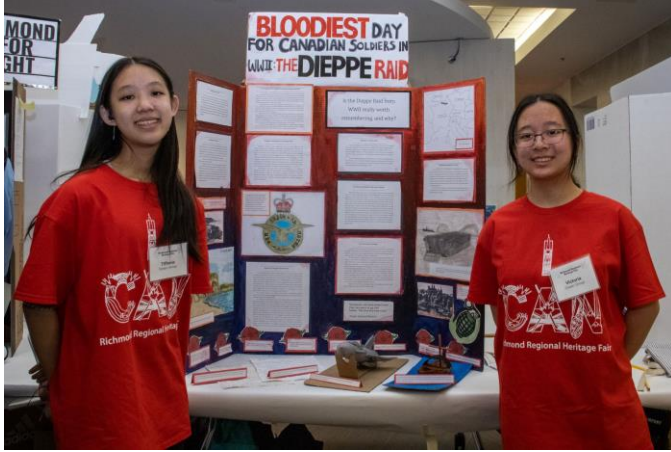

An outstanding project on a topic related to Canada's impact in the world.

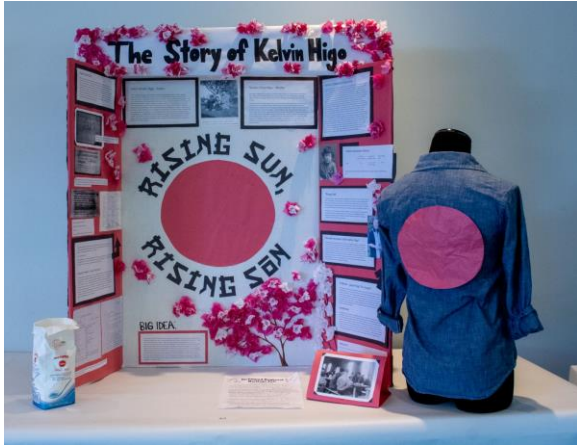
